### Bruce Edward Blackmer, FAIA, Awarded AIA Medal of Honor

Bruce E. Blackmer, FAIA, president and CEO of NAC|Architecture, has been awarded the American Institute of Architects (AIA) Northwest and Pacific Region 2007 Medal of Honor. The award is conferred annually on an architect from within the region who has consistently demonstrated excellence in design, the practice of architecture, architectural education, or service to the profession that has promoted public understanding of architects and architecture and who has made notable contributions to the AIA Northwest and Pacific (NW&P) Region. Presentation of the award was made Sept. 29 in Spokane, Wash., at the association's Regional Conference.

Blackmer has been a leader in the profession throughout his career, holding positions as AIA Spokane president, AIA Washington director, AIA NW&P regional director, AIA National vice president, AIA College of Fellows regional representative, American Architec-

tural Foundation (AAF) regent, National Architectural Accrediting Board (NAAB) director, and NAAB 2007-2008 president. He chaired multiple regional committees, led the multi-regional and international Summit 2000, and ultimately as senior director of the NW&P Region led the reorganization and development of the region's focused vision that the organization has today. He chaired the AIA Professional Interest Area (PIA) Executive Committee and led its consolidation with the PIA Council and their transformation to the AIA Board Knowledge Committee along with the re-visioning of the PIAs, creating the AIA's Knowledge Communities and raising the recognition of architecture as a knowledge-based profession nationally and internationally. In addition to his leadership for the AIA, AAF and NAAB, Blackmer is on the advisory board of the Washington State University School of Architecture in Pullman, Wash., and the Interdisciplinary Design Institute in Spokane. He is frequently an awards juror, speaks nationally and is a lecturer at several universities.

Blackmer received a Bachelor of Architecture degree from North Dakota State University and a Master's in Business Administration from Gonzaga University.

With origins in 1960 and a staff of more than 150, NAC|Architecture serves clients from offices in Seattle and Spokane, Wash.; Coeur d'Alene, Idaho; and Los Angeles.

## President's Corner

### Bill Froemke AIA, Chapter President



As my year at President nears its end, I find myself inclined to write about a topic that is a bit more controversial than usual. At least it seems to be jarring on a National level within our profession. The topic: "Diversity". My challenge: Write an article thorough enough to cover my opinions, yet short enough to publish!

What does the term "diversity" mean when attached to the profession of architecture? From personal observation, I find it difficult to accept that it is the ethnic and/or gender issue that I have been lead to believe. I wrote last year, in my report from Grassroots, that one specific speaker at that conference "came out shooting" about this topic, claiming architecture is a "white macho male society" that did not allow women or minorities the opportunities they deserve. She thinned out the crowd quickly!

But did people leave because they were offended at the absurdity of this claim, or because they knew it was true and didn't want to hear about it? I had many conversations that week with my peers around the Country. None seemed to be able to confirm such accusations but, again - was that because they didn't want to? I looked around congregations at that conference and saw a large population of women and minorities in the audience - although, true, most were Caucasian males. I have continued my informal observations over the past year-and-a-half - at the National Convention, at our Regional Conference, and even within our own ranks. Although the majority of attendees are white males, I don't see the oppression that is being claimed and I am inclined to express my opinion that this is not as critical of a problem as we are lead to believe. But is this really what diversity in architecture is all about?

I believe diversity in architecture is not solely (or even primarily) about ethnic or gender issues. Those challenges exist in this profession, just as they do in probably every profession. But I believe we are being duped into someone else's agenda and missing the entire message about diversity. Diversity is not Equality!

The AIA Diversity Committee has published the following mission statement - *I've attached some personal narrative:*

- Expand the diversity of the design professions to mirror the society that we serve.

*What is this "society" - I believe it is our client. Obviously, the demographics of diversity will change from region to region - or from client to client. It shouldn't be dictated as a generality.*

- Promote awareness of the contributions of architects from under-represented racial, ethnic, gender, sexual orientation, age or disability groups.

*Why not promote awareness of the contributions of ALL architects. If it's notable, why be concerned with the race, gender, etc. of the architect from whom it came?! That just adds to discrimination claims.*

- Encourage alternatives to traditional practice models.  
*Thinking "out of the box" is important in a progressive company. What these alternative models might be depends on the ingenuity of those implementing them.*

- Provide opportunities for an ever-greater variety of individuals to become architects, take advantage of leadership opportunities, and influence our practices and our professional lives.

*I believe the term "variety" in this statement refers to an individual's*

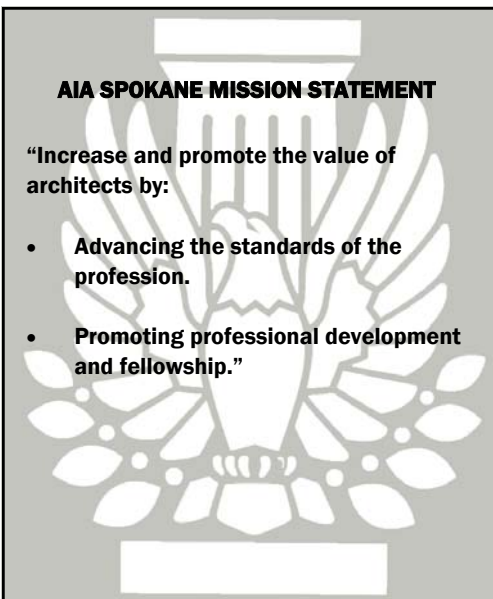

*interests and experience, not gender or ethnic background. We can all learn from variety in our profession – evolving our thoughts and designs.*

The benefit of diversification in architecture is that we would then be better able to tap the resources we've provided for ourselves to help solve the challenges we're faced with in the profession. It is the clients we serve, that pay our bills and that become disgruntled if not receiving the expected service. We need to diversify to accommodate them. As a result, it is the client who dictates which 'groups' are under-represented. Those groups are not necessarily gender or ethnic related. Most likely, our client demands someone who understands a particular occupancy group, construction type or building style.

Challenging architects to practice diversity should not be a barrage of insults or negative claims based on race and gender issues, such as were made by the speaker at Grassroots and as continue to be voiced in chat rooms. It should be a productive and motivating opportunity to broaden ones understanding of a group, or of an environment, or a way of life...to go beyond the arrogance of believing that your way is the only way...to 'think outside of the box'! Diversity is important to the success of our profession and to our individual practices, as well. We need to encourage both men and women of all ethnic backgrounds, with variety of experience and interests, to explore their value in architecture and to develop their skills. I am a true believer that everyone is created equal. But equality is not the same as diversity, and neither should promote the aligning of demographic proportions to society, in general. Both, in my opinion, should be based on attributes such as acquired skill, passion for ones interest, and hard work in obtaining ones goals.

The most successful entrepreneurs are those who can recognize a niche that needs to be filled and then provide that service. I believe diversity in architecture can be accomplished with similar entrepreneurial activity – not by filling a quota! I hope I've got you thinking! I welcome any rebuttals or support of this opinion and look forward to reading them in this newsletter.

### NEW! Professional

#### Community Service Credits - CES

Effective immediately, AIA members are now permitted to request by self-report, 2 AIA LU hours of continuing education per calendar year for **Professional Community Service**. The credits are not eligible for HSW. **Professional Community Service** includes a member's volunteer services on committees, boards, and other projects that promote the architectural profession. Please note that this allowance is for the AIA/CES requirement only.

### CONTRACT DOCUMENTS 2007 UPDATE

#### On November 5, the AIA will launch its 2007 Update to AIA Contract Documents,

On November 5, the AIA will formally release the updated 2007 AIA Contract Documents - 49 revised, new, and renumbered documents and commentaries. AIA components that are Full-Service Distributors (FSD) will be promoting those documents. AIA Contract Documents are acknowledged as the most balanced documents in the design and construction industry and, therefore, are the most widely used standard form agreements in the construction marketplace. It's not just a marketing slogan to say that they are the industry standard - our market research proves it.

However, as the design and construction industry evolves, so do the AIA Contract Documents. In response to changing industry practices, the Institute began a process four years ago to consult and collaborate with representatives of other organizations in the construction industry to publish the most up-to-date agreements in the industry. Only through wide solicitation of input can we understand the needs of all contracting parties and publish the most fair and balanced documents offered anywhere.

The major changes you'll see in the 2007 Update of the AIA Contract Documents include the following:

1. In owner/contract agreements that incorporate AIA Contract Document A201TM-2007 General Conditions of the Contract for Construction, the owner and contractor now have the option to engage an Initial Decision Maker to make initial decisions on claims. This option responds to owner and contractor groups who questioned the architect's impartiality and requested an alternative to the architect's involvement in the resolution of claims.
2. Agreements now allow the consolidation of arbitrations, a concept that owners and contractors requested to allow economical resolution of claims involving multiple parties.
3. Arbitration is now optional in both owner/contractor and owner/architect agreements, a provision that responds to

changing views about the merits of mandatory arbitration.

4. State law now governs the statute of limitations for filing claims in both owner/architect and owner/contractor agreements, subject to a 10-year cutoff following substantial completion.

For a comprehensive explanation of these and other changes go to [www.aia.org](http://www.aia.org). The 2007 updates will be released simultaneously in both paper format and AIA software. To help users of AIA Contract Documents software make the transition, access is provided to both new and retired versions of the documents until May 31, 2009. The software will also provide access to a host of supporting information, such as commentaries and comparisons about the 2007 documents, that will also be available free of charge via [www.aia.org](http://www.aia.org). Paper customers will be able to purchase the retired versions from paper distributors throughout the transition period as long as inventory lasts.
